



2017 ICP Cycle: size of the economies



2017 ICP Cycle: GDP per capita




PPP-based GDP, GDP per capita and GDP price level index, 2017





Bubble size for each economy shows its relative PPP-based GDP. Source: World Bank


Index of PPP-based expenditure per capita for GDP and major expenditure components, by region an income group, 2017 (World = 100)









Questionnaires received. Household consumption. Years 2019, 2020 y 2021






Questionnaires received - Special Surveys 2021

Challenges in the implementation of the 2021 PCI cycle

Financial and human resource constraints

Challenges of COVID-19 on statistical work:

- Lockdown and mobility restrictions
- Post pandemic (2021 and 2022) stores closure.

Conduct of Census Round in the Caribbean region (Barbados, Bahamas).

Natural disasters in LAC countries (Haiti, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines)

Delay in data submission from Caribbean countries, overlapping of census tasks and ICP implementation (April-May 2022)

Delay in data submission from LAC countries due to staff changes
