- How would you rate your organization in its implementation of effective land administration procedures?


- How accessible is the information on the use and condition of the managed lands?

To date, 21 member states have responded the survey, representing 58,3% from the 36 Member States of the Americas

 Ten of the responses indicate that the concept of land administration is known and applied appropriately.




 The cadaster, registry and territorial planning are the two topics that are considered most relevant.








 40.74% of the responses indicate that the institutions represented are related to land administration and in addition 62.96% indicate that the implementation of related procedures has been adequate.












- Furthermore, between 37.3
 reflect that related information
 can be accessible or moderately
 accessible to the general public.
- 77.77% use GIS for modeling related data, and 55.55% indicate that they use an institution's own system to process this data.













• The relationship between institutions involved is rated as good and poor, however adequate communication predominates with a percentage of 40.74%.





